

Need help voting?

If you need support in casting your ballot, the City has options for you.

Accessibility aids

During <u>Advance Voting only</u>, staff will offer accessibility aids to assist persons with disabilities, including a sip and puff device, audio system with headphones to read the ballot, and a magnification device to enlarge the ballot.

Most Voting Places are wheelchair accessible. Voting Place staff are able to assist with curb-side voting for persons unable to leave their vehicle to vote.

Language assistance

Voters requiring assistance in other languages are welcome to bring an interpreter. Many Voting Places will have staff who speak other languages, and all staff have a

direct phone line to translation services for over 180 languages.

VANCOUVER

Who can vote?

To vote in the municipal By-election, you must be:

- 18 years of age or older on General Voting Day
- A Canadian citizen
- A resident of BC for at least 6 months
- A resident of Vancouver for at least 30 days
- · Not be disqualified from voting by law

If you own property in Vancouver but live elsewhere in BC, you may be entitled to vote in the October By-election.

Residents of the University Endowment Lands (the properties around UBC) can only vote for School Trustees.

Who are you voting for?

The 2017 Municipal By-election will elect 1 Councillor and 9 School Trustees. The term of office for these officials will end on the first Monday after November 1 following the 2018 general local election.

City Council

City Council is elected at large. Each Councillor represents the entire city.

Vancouver City Council is governed by the Vancouver Charter and has the power to:

- Pass by-laws regulating such things as businesses, building, noise, and land use
- Buy and sell property
- Collect property and other taxes
- Approve major spending for all parts of the City government
- Take on debt
- Allocate funds for special activities, such as arts and community services
- Set up departments and offices for City services

Through City Council, city residents and businesses are provided with fire and police services, libraries, parks, community centres, garbage collection, streets, sidewalks, traffic lights, water, and sewer services.

School Trustees

School District 39 provides education services within Vancouver and the University Endowment Lands. The School Trustees are independent of Vancouver City Council.

The school district is one of the most diverse in Canada, with an annual enrollment of about 50,000 students in kindergarten to grade 12. The school district is home to 90 elementary schools, one middle school, 18 secondary schools, and two adult learning centres.

No Voter Information Card for 2017

There will be no Voter Information Card sent to each registered voter for the 2017 By-election.

Instead, please read the Are you registered? section of this flyer to see if you are on the voters list and learn how to register to vote. If you are registered on the most current Provincial list of voters, you are automatically on the voters' list.



Are you registered?

If you were registered in the last provincial election, you may already be on the Voters' List. Not sure?

Visit **vancouver.ca/by-election** and use the Am I On the Voters' List tool.

If you are not on the Voters' List, you can register at a Voting Place. You will need to show two pieces of identification (one with a signature) to establish your identity and residence and complete a voter registration form that you will sign in front of an Election Official.

Common forms of ID include:

- · BC Driver's License
- · The new BC Services Card
- BC ID
- BC Care Card
- You can also swear
- Social Insurance CardCitizenship card
- a declaration that counts as one piece
- Credit or debit card

- Passport
- Utility bill

You can download a voter registration form from **vancouver.ca/by-election** in advance.

Own property in Vancouver and live elsewhere?

If you own property in Vancouver but live elsewhere in BC, you may be entitled to vote in the October By-election.

Non-Resident Property Electors must be 18 years of age or older, a Canadian citizen, and have owned the Vancouver property for at least 30 days immediately prior to registering to vote.

How can you vote?

Advance voting

There are two Advance Voting Days where you can cast your vote early.

You can vote between 8 am and 8 pm on October 4 and 10 at **Vancouver City Hall**, 453 West 12th Avenue.

Election Day

On Saturday, October 14, you can cast your ballot at approximately 50 Voting Places throughout the city from 8 am to 8 pm.

Vote by mail

If you are prevented from visiting a Voting Place due to illness, injury or disability or if you plan to be away from the city during October voting times, you can request a Vote by Mail package.
